Who was St. Catherine of Siena?

Saint Catherine of Siena was a 14th-century Italian mystic, theologian and Dominican tertiary who played a crucial role in the religious and political landscape of her time. Born in 1347 in Siena, Italy, Catherine began experiencing mystical visions at a young age, claiming to have received messages from God.
